
Make them feel Your strength; make them see your power. Be with them, Lord, every day, every hour. Amen

Another brother will be leaving in May, also for 'Nam'.







































































Our Communion Table definitely celebrated World Communion Sunday on October 6th as we joined with churches around the globe in sharing this special blessing.
